It is possible to wisely steward your money in such a way that you'll end up greatly blessed...and greatly <u>enabled</u> to bless God and others.

What is the way of the wise? You honor God with your money, and you honor Him <u>first</u>, and then you reap the reward! *1 Samuel 2:30*

I. Give <u>Generously</u>...It's a Sign of Spiritual Health.

The Macedonian believers weren't rich in money...they were rich in grace.

Myths about giving:

- Myth #1 People give because they are more noble.
- Myth #2 People give because they are better resourced.
- Myth #3 People give because they can afford to give.
- Myth #4 People give generously only because they've been manipulated.

Malachi 3:10-12

Tithe is a translation of the Hebrew word for <u>10%</u>...a specific amount. Luke 6:38

If you want to unleash the supernatural flow of blessing in your life...giving is the trigger!

Christians are the most generous and joyful givers because they know that their greatest treasure is the grace and <u>blessing</u> of God.

II. Give <u>Faithfully</u>...It's a Sign of Spiritual <u>Authenticity</u>.

The best barometer of spiritual authenticity is not what people say they believe, but what people actually do <u>because</u> of what they believe.

No one will ever "out-give" God!

The greatest blessings in life come not just from making a commitment, but in keeping a commitment.

One of the wisest things you will learn this year is that God desires to bless you.

God is ready to bless whenever we are ready to obey.
