The Lord Jesus has the power to change the eternal destiny and <u>lifestyle</u> of unrighteous people... no matter what has led them away from God!

I. Understand the Issues.

Four distinct types of homosexual behavior in our culture:

- Experimental homosexual behavior.
- 2. Situational homosexuality.
- 3. Addictive homosexuality.
- Orientational homosexual behavior.

1 Corinthians 10:13

Everyone experiences the impulse of temptation...but not everyone acts out their destructive impulses.

Three factors that contribute to the development of a homosexual orientation:

- Destructive family dynamics.
- 2. Early homosexual <u>experiences</u> with a trusted friend or family member.
- 3. The <u>physiological</u> factor.

The politically correct, urban legend, is that people are born homosexual and any other position is considered intolerant bigotry. But there is not a single conclusive scientific study to validate that position.

Environmental influences are <u>powerful!</u> But they don't mean you are physiologically <u>selected</u> to have a homosexual orientation.

II. Embrace the Truth.

Leviticus 18:22-23 NIV

Some truth about the gay lifestyle:

- Homosexual behavior is numerically rare.
- Homosexual behavior is relationally unfulfilling.
- Homosexual behavior is physically dangerous.
- Homosexual behavior is spiritually transformable.

In Christ, there is hope for change for us all.
