I. Personal <u>Devotion</u> to Their Faith

John's birth story is taking place in a particular place at a particular time that is rooted in history.

Passing faith from one generation to the next requires personal devotion and diligence.

Three things we know about Zechariah and Elizabeth:

1. They were <u>old</u>.

- 2. They were barren. Psalm 127:3-5
- 3. They were poor.

II. Priestly <u>Responsibility</u> at the Temple

One of the priestly duties that was seen as a "once in a lifetime" privilege was to go into the Holy Place in the Temple and burn <u>incense</u> to honor the prayers of God's people.

III. Profound <u>Revelation</u> by Gabriel

Gabriel is one of two angels who are actually mentioned in the Bible by name. The other is named <u>Michael</u>.

- There are thousands and thousands of angels ... some are holy ... some <u>unholy</u>.
- Angels tend to appear in two forms: one is where they look like a regular person.
- Often when angels appear it is OBVIOUS that they are <u>supernatural</u> beings.

Fear is the normal response in the Bible when someone saw an angel.

IV. Predictable But Unacceptable Doubt

It is human nature to doubt the supernatural even when the evidence is right in front of us.

V. Punishing Response to Disbelief

When you believe in God, He expects you to believe Him ... and trust Him!

VI. Provision of a Miracle Child

The birth of John the Baptist was the launch miracle of the New Testament!

God promises when we can't hold any longer, He'll hold onto us.
