JESUS: THE GREAT PHYSICIAN

Jesus Heals a Man Terrorized by Demons, Luke 8:26-39 May 27, 30-31, 2015: Cam Huxford, Senior Pastor

This man in Luke 8 was not injured accidentally, but because he <u>intentionally</u> turned control of his life over to dark forces that were totally destructive.

I. Demonic Terror Yields Destructive Behavior.

The Bible teaches us that there is a physical world and a spiritual world that co-exist.

Ephesians 6:12, Galatians 2:20

It is frustrating to treat with information and medication issues that are related to demonization.

What Demonization Produced in this Man's Life:

- Physical <u>Deprivation</u>
- Spiritual <u>Defeat</u> Galatians 5:22-23
- Personally <u>Despised</u>
- Socially Isolated
- Emotionally <u>Disturbed</u> Mark 5:5

II. Destructive Forces Yield Dramatically to <u>Jesus</u>.

Jesus sees this guy who has made a mess of his life...and doesn't reject him, run from him, look the other way. He asks his <u>name</u>...He wants to know...He cares.

People are often afraid of what they don't understand. 1 John 4:4

Jesus will go anywhere He is invited, but He won't force Himself on anyone.

III. Dramatically Freed People Want to Follow Jesus. 2 Corinthians 5:17

Jesus gave this "new man in Christ" an assignment that was the last thing in the world he wanted to do...but the only thing in the spiritual world he was <u>qualified</u> to do.

Familiar territory is the most <u>fertile</u> ground for ministry.

Impossible situations look different when <u>Jesus</u> gets involved.
