One of the most common <u>concerns</u> about Christianity is: "Why does God, if He has so much power, allow such bad things to happen?

I. Does Jesus Understand the Pain I Feel?

Jesus knows what it's like to face the hardest things in life:

1. Jesus faces the agony of disappointment. Matthew 26:28 NIV

When disappointment threatens to wreck some relationship or push you away from God...draw close to God.

- 2. Jesus faced the agony of <u>anxiety</u>. *Hebrews* 13:5-6; *Psalm* 46:10
- II. Why Does a Good God Allow <u>Bad</u> Things to Happen? 1 Corinthians 13:12
 - 1. We experience evil when free will is mis-used.

Evil choices produce hurtful outcomes.

Sometimes the collateral damage caused by the evil choices of others affects us. John 11:47-48

2. We encounter evil when we honor God's will. John 1:29; Nahum 1:3 NIV

4 words used for sin in the Bible:

- <u>Sin</u>: to fail to do what you know is right.
- Trespass: to insist on doing what you know is wrong.
- <u>Iniquity</u>: to pervert something you know is good.
- Guile: to project something you know is false. 1 John 4:9-10

Propitiation: satisfying the wrath of God by the atoning sacrifice of Jesus.

Sin broke our relationship with God...only the sacrifice of Jesus could make us "at one" again.

The only force in the world that is stronger than the wrath of God...is the grace of God.
