How Can I Share What Jesus Means to Me? Selected Scriptures
May 25, 28-29, 2016: Cam Huxford, Senior Pastor

There is more than one way to share what Jesus means to you!

Six Different Ways to Share What Jesus Means to You:

1. The confrontational way to share what Jesus means to you.

This is the most direct and hard-hitting style of outreach. This is probably what most people think about when they hear the word "evangelism." *Matthew 16:21 NIV*

2. The intellectual way to share what Jesus means to you. *Acts 17:22-23*

Response to hard questions: That's a great question...I'd like to know the answer to that myself. I'll call you with the answer in a couple days.

3. The testimonial way to share what Jesus means to you.

Sometimes the story that we think is mundane relates much better to most people.

Everybody who has a life-changing relationship with Jesus has a life-change story!

4. Interpersonal way to share what Jesus means to you.

This interpersonal contact is huge. This is how the bold, strong Apostle Peter came to know Christ...his quiet, unassuming brother Andrew introduced him to Jesus.

5. The invitational way to share what Jesus means to you.

Anyone can do this. But some people are extremely persuasive at getting people to go places with them.

Churches like ours are great for invitational evangelists... multiple invitational opportunities!

6. Sharing what Jesus means to you by servicing.

People with this approach tend to be other-centered and see needs that the rest of us don't see.

When as a church, we're all praying for one, it creates an environment where people meet Jesus and develop a life long, life-changing relationship with Him.
